Indicator title/Name	IMO White List
Short Definition	International Maritime Organisation is a specialised agency of the United Nations which is responsible for formulating regulatory regime and conventions related to maritime matters. The IMO does not make regulations but the member states who are signatories to the conventions are obliged to adopt the convention and incorporate the same in their domestic law. IMO periodically publishes a list "White List" which indicates that the member states listed in the list are in compliance with the IMO conventions. The republic of South Africa is a member state and signatory to various IMO conventions. South Africa's white list status is confirmed at the annual MSC meeting of 2015
Purpose / Importance	All STCW parties listed in IMO white List provide seafarer training in compliance with the STCW convention as amended.
